It's 4/9/03, 35 years after that early morning we got hit. You, PFC Dennis Reed, and SP4 Thomas Dezey left way too soon. I never heard what happened to the others that were wounded in the FDC tent. They were taken away and never came back. To be honest, I didn't have much time to think about you and the others during the rest of my tour. But I think and say a pray for you, Reed, and Dazey every day. Rest in peace.

It's 4/9/04; 36 years after the 6th/84th Artillery left An Khe for our first night in the field since we arrived in Vietnam on 3/24/68. It was about 2:30 am when the C Battery FDC tent was hit and 2LT Edward Zager, SP4 Thomas Dazey, and PFC Dennis Reed were KIA. C battery also had about 15 WIA's, some of whom were taken away and never seen again. On 5/9/03 I stopped at the final resting place of Edward's at the Mount Sinai Memorial Park/Mortuary, Glendale, California. I plan to stop again during May of this year when I'll be in California to ride in the Run for the Wall. I continue to say a prayer, almost every day for Edward and the others. Rest in peace Edward.
